


World War 2

This term our main topic is World War II. We will be learning about the causes of the war and its impact on different lives in Europe. In the second part of the topic, we will focus on life in Britain, specifically during the Blitz and how evacuation changed the lives of so many.







Over the next term we will share your work at school so make sure you bring things in to school as you complete them!

Try these World War II activities with your family...

Find a list of all the countries that took part in World War II. Use Google Earth, a world map or an atlas to identify where all the countries are. Can you colour them and label them on the world map?



Make your own artefact from World War II - this could be a rationing book, an evacuation case, a gas mask, soldier's helmet or a medal.



Create a fact-file about the life of a child during World War II. This should contain facts about everyday life including evacuation, rationing, the Blitz. Research an aircraft, ship or tank that took part in WWII. Make a model, drawing or collage and don't forget to include a description.




